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

Entry Requirements

Applicants must be eligible to study in New Zealand and:

- Be 16 years of age and above or

- Have an approved Ministry of Education Early Leaving Exemption (ELX)

Programme Content

- Goal setting.

This programme is designed to support learners who want to gain confidence and upskill in reading, writing, working with numbers and communication.

Students will attend between 80 to 300 hours at an intensity of 5-20 hours per week depending upon their needs.

Upon successful completion learners may be able to go on to enrol in the NZ Certificate in Foundation Skills Level 1 programme which equates to NCEA Level 1.

Entry Requirements

- Open Entry.
- A Certificate of Approval (COA) is required to work in the security industry. To obtain a COA you will be required to undergo a criminal history check. Not all offences will prohibit gaining a COA.
- Students must be 18 years old to hold a COA.
- A reasonable level of fitness is expected to carry out the practical components of the course.

- How to communicate effectively.
- Professional conduct.
- Operation of security equipment.

- Confidentiality in a security context.
- Personal safety.
- Responding to emergencies and critical situations as a security officer.

Outline

The NZ Certificate in Security (Foundation) Level 3 programme is a nationally recognised qualification.

It is designed for those who wish to be employed in roles within the security or related industries.

The programme also provides a base for higher education. A variety of learning and teaching approaches will be used, including classroom lectures, supervised workshops and scenarios, quizzes, practical hands on work experience and self directed learning.

Entry Requirements

Applicants must be 16 years of age or over and eligible to study in New Zealand. They must have NCEA Level 1 or equivalent.

Programme Content

- Practical on site industry training.
- Gain practical competencies and skills in workplace health and safety.
- Trade mathematics, hand tools and project work related to different aspects of the construction industry.

- Learn how to make and place concrete.
- Assemble and erect timber and steel wall frames.
- Safely use portable power tools used for construction work.
- Graduate work-ready with transferable skills for a wide range of construction-related trades.

Outline

The New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Carpentry) Level 3 programme is available in response to industry demand for skilled workers in the Horowhenua. With growth projected to continue, now is the time to train to enter the trade workforce.

It is an entry level programme that may lead to apprenticeships in specific trades. This programme will focus on learning practical skills needed in the construction industry. Learning will be a combination of in class plus on site practical learning. You'll enjoy trips to local construction sites and visits from industry experts, and work on a range of exciting projects.

- NCEA Level 1 (including 10 Literacy and 10 Numeracy credits) or equivalent.
- For applicants over 20 years of age there are no minimum academic requirements.
- Acceptance is subject to a background check from the NZ Police Licensing & Vetting Agency.
- Students must complete a Health Declaration form.

Programme Content

- Support a person to meet personal care needs.
- Demonstrate and apply knowledge of professional and ethical behaviour.
- Support people to use assistive equipment and move in health or wellbeing setting.
- Apply effective communication skills.
- Help people preserve their independence.

LTTM (Life to the Max) Social Services

Our focus is to help young people realise their full potential and support them to create opportunities for their future.

The Youth Service team, made up of youth coaches and social workers support this vision by connecting young people into education and employment.

Youth Engagement

If you're aged between 16-17 years old, haven't quite got NCEA level 1 and/or 2, and would like support to either stay in education or to find a course that will help lead you into a job, our Youth Coaches can help. We can pay for your driver's licence, help you create a CV and get a job - whatever it takes to make your dreams come true come and see us!

NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training)

- Are you 16 or 17 years old?
- Got dreams of what you want to be doing when you turn 18 but don't know how you're going to get there?
- Haven't quite got NCEA Level 1 and/or 2?
- Would you like some help to either stay in school, get into a course or start preparing for work?

Youth coaches can help put together a plan for you to achieve NCEA level 1 & 2 either at school or in a course. Working with a youth coach means one on one support and regular catch ups to ensure that you're staying on track to achieve your goals.

Youth Payment and Young Parent Payment

YOUTH PAYMENT (YP)

The Youth Payment (or Independent Youth Benefit) is a weekly payment that you may be entitled to if can't live at home. There are certain criteria that you must meet to be eligible. If you're aged 16-20 years old, give us a call and we can talk about eligibility and how to apply.

YOUNG PARENT PAYMENT

The Young Parent Payment is a weekly payment for young parents aged 16-20 years old to help financially support themselves and their baby. The payment is available to both mothers and fathers, there is set criteria that you must meet to be eligible.

The payment cannot begin until the baby is born, but you can start the application before the birth. Give us a call and we can talk you through the process.
